2012 WORLD LIFESAVING CHAMPIONSHIPS CANADIAN 16-19 YEARS OLD DEVELOPMENT TEAM SELECTION CRITERIA

Name of Competition: World Lifesaving Championships – Rescue 2012
Adelaide, Australia

Tour Dates: 30 October – 12 November 2012

Team Membership: Six (6) females; Six (6) males

Fundraising Commitment: Approximately \$4,000.00 per athlete

Eligibility

World Lifesaving Championships are intended for *bona fide* lifesavers who have demonstrated a commitment to lifesaving – athletes who are lifesavers first, competitors second.

To be eligible to compete as a member of the Development Team representing Canada at the 2012 World Lifesaving Championships, the member shall:

- Be a bona fide lifesaver in good standing with the Canadian Lifesaving Society.
- Hold a **current** Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross or National Lifeguard certification that is dated no more than two years prior to 12 November 2012.
- Be a registered athlete with Lifesaving/Sauvetage Canada.
- Be a Canadian citizen, by birth or naturalization; or landed immigrant of Canada.
- Be a minimum of 16 years of age and a maximum of 19 years of age as of the first day of the World Championships (8 Nov. 2012).
- If under 18 years of age during the duration of the tour, parental/tutor authorization is required.
- Be willing to register with, and be tested by, the World Anti-doping Agency.
- Be willing to participate in designated training camps or regimens as required by the National Lifesaving Team Head Coach.
- Be available for the duration of the championship tour (approximately 30 October to 12 November 2012).

Selection Philosophy

Selection criteria are aimed at selecting the 16-19 years old development team that will provide the best long-term overall outcome for the National Team. This may mean selecting the best athletes in a discipline where we stand little chances to perform in internationally but with the expectation that this experience will improve our long term standings. Meeting a criterion does not grant an automatic selection to the team as a given athlete's contribution to the team will need to be assessed against what other athletes meeting one or more of the criteria can bring to the team.

Selection Criteria:

16-19 years old development team athletes representing Canada at the 2012 World Lifesaving Championships shall be selected based on their performance at the designated competitions identified below. In order to be selected for this event, an athlete must at least meet the eligibility criteria.

- Eligible athletes will be selected based on performances at the 2011 Commonwealth Lifesaving Championships, the 2012 Canadian Pool Lifesaving Championships and National Sport Commission sanctioned events (e.g. time trials, international events) completed from 1 October 2011 up to 24 August 2012 inclusive (or the start of the 2012 Canadian Surf Lifesaving Championships). Eligible athletes will be selected based on performances listed in the 2012 World Lifesaving Championships official Program of Events.
- Athletes who wish to be selected based on a performance outside of Canada must meet the following: The competition must be an International Life Saving Federation (ILS) sanctioned competition. The athlete must submit a letter of intent to the National Sport Commission, Lifesaving/Sauvetage Canada, and request approval to use the international competition for selection purposes. The competition must be pre-approved by the National Sport Commission and be held between 1 October 2011 and 24 August 2012 inclusive (or the start of the 2012 Canadian Surf Lifesaving Championships).
- Athletes who wish to be selected to the touring Development Team must either be active members of the National or Development Team roster, or submit a formal expression of interest to the High Performance Manager or a member of the selection committee outlining prior to the selection of the Development Team.
- Eligible athletes must receive a unanimous nomination from all members of the National Team selection committee.

Consideration for team selection will be in the following order:

- Performance equal to a top 24 finish (based on Rescue 2010 National Teams World Championship preliminary times) in any individual ILS pool event performed.
- A win at the 2012 Canadian Surf Lifesaving Championships in the 16-19 years old category (or Open) in:
 - Beach Flags AND Beach Sprint;
 - At least two surf events (Surf Swim, Surf Ski, Board and Oceanman events);
 - Surf Swim combined with a Top 32 finish in any individual ILS pool event (based on Rescue 2010 National Teams World Championship preliminary times).
- Performance equal to a top 32 finish (based on Rescue 2010 National Teams World Championship preliminary times) in any individual ILS pool event performed.
- Performance equal to a top 8 finish (based on Rescue 2010 National Teams World Championship preliminary times) in the line throw event as the thrower.
- A 2012 Canadian Surf or Pool Championships podium in the 16-19 years old category (or Open) in any individual event on the Program of Events of Rescue 2012.
- In the event that the above criteria are deemed by the selection committee to be insufficient to finalize the selection of the team, alternative consideration will be given at the discretion of the selection committee to:
 1. Performance equal to a top 32 finish+15% (based on Rescue 2010 National Teams World Championship preliminary times) in any individual ILS pool event performed.
 2. Swimming results as recorded in the Swim Canada database within the past 24 months

3. Past international results from a recognized competition in the Simulated Emergency Response Competition (SERC) event within the past 24 months.

Selection Process

The selection process for the 2012 World Lifesaving Championships will be held in two stages as follows:

1. At the outcome of the 2012 Canadian Pool Lifesaving Championships, the National Team Selection Committee will reserve the right to name up to 12 members to the touring Development team.
2. In the event that the team remains incomplete at the outcome of the 2012 Canadian Surf Lifesaving Championships, a full 16-19 years old Development Team 12-person Rescue 2012 delegation will formally be announced.

Selection Committee

The National Team selection committee will proceed with the nominations at the conclusion of the 2012 Canadian Pool Lifesaving Championships and subsequent selection of the final 12-person Rescue 2012 at the conclusion of the 2012 Canadian Surf Lifesaving Championships.

Alternates

The National Team selection committee may select one or more alternates at their discretion to ensure that a number of athletes are competition ready and prepared to assume a position on the team in the event that a previously selected athlete was to pull out (due to health or other reasons) or be removed from the team.

Decisions

All decisions of the selection committee are considered to be unanimous and final.

Appeals

An aggrieved athlete may appeal against a failure of the selection committee to comply with the procedures as set down in this policy. That is, an appeal may be made on procedural grounds, but not on the merits of a particular selection decision.

This appeal must be made to the Sport Commissioner within ten (10) days of public announcement of the World Lifesaving Championships Team.

- This appeal must be in writing setting out:
 - 1) The particular alleged failure of the selection in question
 - 2) Grounds on which the appeal is made; and,
 - 3) The reasons or circumstances supporting the alleged appeal.
- The appeal must be accompanied by a \$100.00 deposit in Canadian funds, refundable in the case of a successful appeal.
- The appeal will be reviewed by the Sports Commissioner and two available members of the National Sport Commission who shall have no significant relationship with the affected parties and shall have no involvement with the decision being appealed, and shall be free from any other actual or perceived bias or conflict.
